

חומש שמות - גב. פרנס-יב

The class will be studying חומש שמות and will be focusing on the themes of the development of כלל ישראל as a nation and their relationship with 'הstarting with שעבוד מצרים and ending with the construction of the משכן.

The class will be an accelerated class conducted in Ivrit. We will work on improving skills and in understanding the workings of רש"י and other מפרשים . Concentration will be on finding the basis and proofs of these מפרשים for their explanations. We will be moving fast!!!

There will be a lot of preparation on your own and with study partners. Frequent review and written expression will lead to natural memorization. The beginning of every class will be devoted to skill building. Only minimal questions will be allowed during class. Students will be expected to look up and research answers themselves. Support will be available after class.

During the second semester the class will work on an extensive research project.

The class will be comprised of two sections; Skills and Content.

Skills Objectives:

1. To develop the skills to decode pessukim and Rashis.
2. To learn to dissect words based on prefixes and suffixes.
3. To build a vocabulary of Shorashim.
4. To cover basic dikduk skills such as possessive, past, present and future conjugation, smichut, nifal, and to intergrate these skills into the Chumash learning process.
5. To have a feeling of confidence when reading Chumash and Rashi.
6. Students will know Rashi abbreviations and recurrent Rashi phrases.
7. To become an independent learner.

Method: In-class instruction and speed/timed reading

Quizzes and in-class reviews

Students will have a skills section in their notebook. There will be cumulative quizzes throughout the year.

All skills worksheets will be kept year to year throughout high school.
