Answers to commonly asked questions

Does every girl get accepted to Temima?

Not every girl will be happy at Temima, and not every girl is a good fit for our program. We have standards that each girl must meet, educationally and emotionally. Visit our website for more information about these standards.

Does my daughter need to take any tests as part of the application process?

For evaluation and placement purposes, your daughter will be required to take entrance exams. Information as to details regarding these exams will follow.

How long is the school day?

Temima begins the day with Davening promptly at 8 am. Though each girl's schedule may vary daily, the school day is over between 4:00 and 5:30 pm Monday through Thursday. School ends at 2:30 pm on Erev Shabbos.

We hear that there are a lot of extracurricular activities. Is attendance mandatory?

Activities are an integral and important part of Temima. We weave the extracurricular activities into our curriculum and the entire activity program is part of our Torah learning and character training. Attendance is mandatory unless otherwise indicated.

Do you have a scholarship fund?

At this point, there is no formal scholarship fund, although the Board of Trustees has made its establishment a priority. Each local student's family is responsible for their full tuition and fundraising obligation. If there is a financial need, you may apply online to FACTS and fill out the required forms that are available from the Temima office to adjust your tuition/fundraising ratio. Out of town students must pay the tuition and fees in full.

Do Temima graduates go to Israel?

Most of Temima's graduates go to Israel for a year or two of study immediately after high school.

Do Temima graduates go to college?

97% of Temima graduates go to college, and most of those seek advanced degrees. Temima prepares students for any college that they choose.

What is Temima's immunization policy?

All students must present a Georgia Form 3231 complete for school. Temima does not accept religious exemptions.
